Ummeed believes its collaborative approach in education has constantly propagated the idea of counselling skills to be used more consciously by educators in schooling set ups. In the last 2 years, through a basic counselling skills course, specifically designed for handling adolescent issues and parent child relations, we have trained more than 175 teachers, coordinators and primary care givers. From April 2015, 5 batches of the Ummeed BCS course was initiated at the following locations – In Rourkela hosted by the St. Pauls School, Sunbeam group of institutions, Varanasi, Sunbeam School Mughaisaral, The Frank Anthony Public School Kolkata, and South Point School Kolkata. Basic Counselling Skill Course at Ummeed Centre

The Basic Counselling Skills Course at Ummeed centre was launched for counsellors, students of psychology, educators and retired teachers who have come forward to develop an understanding of real issues underlying behavioural and academic discrepancies among children and adolescents, and to deal effectively with the same through hands on training in counselling skills, role plays which are based on real case studies.

Mount Litera Zee School (Howrah) Project by - Dhwani Sheth





I have been working at Ummeed since July 2015 and the experience has been extremely stimulating for me as a professional due to the wide exposure I received. One of the most significant aspect of this was the opportunity to visit Mount Litera Zee School, Howrah as a counselor. My association with the school gave me an insight about the partnership between parents and teachers. I was also able to interact with students who come from diverse backgrounds. Due to their high level of acceptance of the counseling process I was immediately made to feel a part of the school. A few issues that I addressed in one-one counseling include peer relationships, study skills, low self esteem, adjustment related difficulties and bullying. We conducted lifeskills for students of all classes based on age appropriate topics such as memory for class 5, respect and responsibility for classes 4 and 7, gender sensitivity for class 8 and friendship for class 6. In order to make the approach more holistic in nature, a session with parents and two sessions with teachers were also organised at the school.

Today I have learnt that the male and female both should get equal opportunities to what they want to - Samrat Das. Class 8

Mount Litera Zee School, both branches at Maheshtala and Howrah, have joined hands with Ummeed in April 2015. The process began with building trust and sensitization of teachers and parents, in order to create holistic support and care for students through individual and group counselling.

At The Heritage School with day boarding schooling concept counselling support to students is an ongoing process catering to life skills issues as well as one to one counselling to enhance academic performance and cope with personal. Teachers were empowered and sensitized about child's psyche and adolescent issues on a regular basis at junior and senior levels. Parents as partners, orienting them to understand their role with changing roles.

In our 5th year of outreach, Ummeed's prime focus with partner schools has been to emphasize on Capacity building for Educators and Lifeskills for students, particularly addressing Bullying and Internet Addiction. The Basic Counselling Skills Training programme has been enabling teachers to be better equipped with an understanding of adolescent psyche and challenges.

With the rise of issues related to bullying, specially, Cyber bullying, Ummeed has concentrated on middle school students to enable them to develop better social skills and assertiveness to deal with the phenomena. The highlight of such initiatives has been the Anti Bullying Campaign, wherein students were able to determine various strategies to make schools a Bully Free Zone with holistic support of school authorities and bystanders who witness such acts of bullying. Students have also developed a growing awareness that being more vigilant with social media, would help to reduce instances of cyber bullying.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME AT UMMEED FOR PSYGHOLOGY STUDENTS

Ummeed has collaborated with the Human Development Department at JD Birla College, Kolkata, for internship opportunities for the 2rd time this year. The Interns from JD Birla, Ms. *Priyanka Agarwal and Ms. Tulika Dey* completed a two month internship which provided a hands-on experience on the application of positive psychology and strength based counselling in the real world scenario.

Over the years Ummeed has seen interns from Christ College Bangalore, Women's Christian College, Chennai, Amity University, Delhi, Loreto College Kolkata and many more. Our internship programme focuses on giving students of psychology a diverse exposure to the application of counselling in the real world set up.

One of the interesting projects undertaken by Priyanka and Tulika during their internship was a small scale social research that reflects the Trend of Abusive Language Among Children and Adolescents. The study conducted on 50 children (boys and girls between the ages of 9-14 years) shows how at a younger age abuse is part of exploration or seeking recognition among peers, and goes on to become an inherent part of their expression during adolescence.
